SETTLEMENT AND RELEASE AGREEMENT

1. INTRODUCTION

1.1. Clean Product Advocates, LLC and Takari International.

This Settlement Agreement is entered into by and between Clean Product Advocates, LLC("CPA"), on the one hand, and Takari International ("Takari"), on the other hand, with CPA and Takari collectively referred to as the "Parties."

1.2. General Allegations

CPA alleges that Takari manufactured and distributed and offered for sale in the State of California Krobe Shrimp Cracker containing Lead, and that such sales have not included warnings pursuant to the Safe Drinking Water and Toxic Enforcement Act of 1986, California Health & Safety Code sections 25249.6 et seq. and its implementing regulations ("Proposition 65"). California has identified and listed Lead under Proposition 65 as a chemical known to the State of California to cause cancer, birth defects or other reproductive harm.

1.3. Product Description

The products that are covered by this Settlement Agreement are defined as Krobe Shrimp Cracker that Takari has manufactured, imported, sold, offered for sale or distributed in California. All such items shall be referred to herein as the "Products."

1.4. Notice of Violation

On May 25, 2022, CPA served, Takari and other parties, and the requisite public enforcement agencies eligible to initiate Proposition 65 actions on behalf of the People of the State of California with a document entitled "60-Day Notice of Violation" ("Notice") that provided Takari and such public enforcers with notice that Takari was allegedly in violation of California Health & Safety Code section 25249.6 for failing to warn consumers and customers that the Products exposed users in California to Lead. To the best of the Parties' knowledge, no public enforcer has commenced or is diligently prosecuting the allegations set forth in the Notice.

1.5. No Admission

The Parties enter into this Settlement Agreement to settle disputed claims between them as set forth herein and in the Notice concerning Takari's compliance with Proposition 65. Takari denies the material factual and legal allegations contained in CPA's Notice and maintains that all products that it has manufactured for sale and distribution in California, including the Products, have been and are in compliance with Proposition 65 or any other statutory, regulatory, common law or equitable doctrine. Nothing in this Settlement Agreement shall be construed as an admission by Takari of any fact, finding, issue of law, or violation of law; nor shall compliance

with this Settlement Agreement constitute or be construed as an admission by Takari of any fact, binding, conclusion, issue of law, or violation of law, such being specifically denied by Takari on its behalf. However, nothing in this section shall diminish or otherwise affect the obligations, responsibilities, and duties of Takari_under this Settlement Agreement.

1.6. Effective Date

For purposes of this Settlement Agreement, the term "Effective Date" shall mean the date this Settlement Agreement is fully executed.

2. INJUNCTIVE RELIEF: REFORMULATION AND WARNINGS

As of the Effective Date, Takari, its sole discretion, agrees to either (a) cease selling, offering for sale or distributing the Products in California, (b) manufacture, import, or otherwise source for authorized sale in California only Reformulated Products, as defined pursuant to Section 2.1 below, or (c) provide a clear and reasonable Proposition 65 warning on the Products pursuant to Section 2.2 below.

2.1. Reformulation Standards

The Products shall be deemed to comply with Proposition 65 with regard to Lead and be exempt from any Proposition 65 warning requirements for Lead if the level of Lead in the Products does not exceed 0.5 micrograms of lead per day ("Reformulated Products"). Products that were supplied or contracted to be supplied to third parties by Takari prior to 6 months after the Effective Date shall be deemed exempted from the requirements of this Section 2 and shall be permitted to be sold through as previously manufactured, packaged and labeled.

2.2. Warning Option

Products that do not meet the warning exemption standard set forth in Section 2.1 above shall be accompanied by a warning as described in Section 2.3 below. This warning requirement shall only be required as to Products that are manufactured, distributed, marketed, imported, sold, shipped for sale or offered for sale to consumers by Takari in the State of California. No Proposition 65 warning shall be required for any Products that are supplied or contracted to be supplied to third parties by Takari prior to 6 months after the Effective Date, and all such Products are hereby deemed to be exempt from Proposition 65 enforcement.

2.3. Warning Language

(a) Where required to meet the criteria set forth in Section 2.2, Takari_shall display one of the following warning statements on the packaging label of the Products that do not meet the warning exemption standard set forth in Section 2.1 above:

(1) **WARNING**: Consuming this product can expose you to chemicals including Lead, which [is] are known to the State of California to cause [cancer and] birth defects or other reproductive harm. For more information go to "www.P65Warnings.ca.gov/food

(2) WARNING: [Cancer and] Reproductive Harm- www.P65Warnings.ca.gov/food

Takari may use "cancer and" in the warning at its option. Takari may include the names of additional chemicals in the warning if they are present in the Products at a level that Takari reasonably believes would require a Proposition 65 warning.

- (b) The requirements for warnings, set forth in subsection (a) above, are imposed pursuant to the terms of this Settlement Agreement. The Parties recognize that these are not the exclusive methods of providing a warning under Proposition 65 and its implementing regulations. Takari shall be deemed to be in compliance with the warning requirements of this Settlement Agreement by either adhering to this Section 2.3 or by complying with the Proposition 65 warning requirements adopted by the State of California Office of Environmental Health Hazard Assessment ("OEHHA") as of or after the Effective Date.
- (c) If Proposition 65 warnings for Lead should no longer be required, Takari shall have no further obligations pursuant to this Settlement Agreement in regards to warning requirement or reformulation.

3. PENALTIES PURSUANT TO HEALTH & SAFETY CODE SECTION 25249.7(b)

In full satisfaction of all potential civil penalties and attorney's fees, costs and any other expenses incurred by CPA or its counsel. Takari shall pay the total Settlement amount of Fiftheen Thousand Dollars (\$15,000) (The "Settlement Amount") as set forth below.

3.1 Civil Penalties to Health & Safety Code 25249.7 (B):

Seven Hundred and Fifty Dollars of the Settlement Amount shall be considered a "civil penalty" pursuant to California Health and Safety Code. XYZ shall issue two separate checks within ten (10) days of the Effective Date for a total amount of Five Hundred Dollar (\$500) as follows, and all payments shall be delivered to the addresses listed below.

- 3.1 (a) One Check made payable to the State of California's Office of Enviornmental Health Hazzard Assessment ("OEHHA") in the amount of Three Hundred and Seventy Five Dollars (\$375), representing 75% of the total civil penalty; and
- 3.1 (b) One check payable to "Clean Product Advocates, LLC" in the amount of One Hundred and Twenty Five Dollar (\$125), representing 25% of the total civil penalty.

3.2 Attorney's Fees and Costs:

Fourteen Thousand and Five Hundred Dollar (\$14,500) of the total Settlement Amount shall be paid to Cliffwood Law Firm, PC within the following dates set bellow as of the Effective Date,

as CPA's attorneys, for reasonable investigation fees, and costs, attorney's fees, and any other cost incurred as a result of investigating and bringing this matter to Takari's attention.

Takari to pay the following amounts on the dates below:

- (a) \$5,500 within in 15 days of the Effective Date.
- (b) \$4,500 within in 30 days of the Effective Date.
- (c) \$4,500 within in 45 days of the Effective Date.

4. PAYMENT PROCEDURES

4.1 All Payments owed to OEHHA, pursuant to section 3.1(a) shall be delivered directly to OEHHA (Memo line "Prop 65 Penalties NOV #2022-01071) at the following address:

4.4 PROOF OF PAYMENT

A copy of each check payable to OEHHA, shall be mailed to Cliffwood Law firm, PC, simultaneous with payment to Cliffwood Law Firm, PC at the address set forth above, as proof of payment to OEHHA.

5. RELEASE OF ALL CLAIMS

5.1. Release of Takari, Downstream Customers and Upstream Vendors

In further consideration of the promises and agreements herein contained, and for the payments to be made pursuit to Section 3 and 4 above, CPA, on behalf of itself, its past and current agents, representatives, attorneys, successors and/or assignees, hereby waives all rights to institute or participate in, directly or indirectly, any form of legal action and releases all claims relating to the Products, including, without limiting, all actions, and causes of action, in law, suits, liabilities, obligations, damages, costs, fines, penalties, losses, or expenses known or unknown against (a) Takari, (b) each of Takari's downstream distributors (including but not limited to Great Wall Supermarket, Seafood City, 99 Ranch Market), wholesalers, vendors, retailors and (c) Takari's parent companies, corporate affiliates and their respective officers, directors, attorneys, agents and employees (collectively "Releasees").

CPA also, in its capacity, on behalf of itself, it's past and current agents, attorneys and/or assignees and *not* in its representative capacity provides a general release herein which shall be effective as a full and final accord and satisfaction as a bar to all actions, obligations, costs, expenses, attorney's fees, damages, losses, claims, liabilities and demands of any nature, character or kind, known or unknown against Takari and the Releasees.

5.2. Takari's Release of CPA

Takari waives any and all claims against CPA, its attorneys and other representatives, for any and all actions taken or statements made (or those that could have been taken or made) by CPA and its attorneys and other representatives, whether in the course of investigating claims or otherwise seeking enforcement of Proposition 65 against it in this matter, and/or with respect to the Products.

A general release does not extend to claims that the creditor or releasing party does not know or suspect to exist in his or her favor at the time of executing the release and that, if known by him or her, would have materially affected his or her settlement with the debtor or released party.

6. GOVERNING LAW

The terms of this Settlement Agreement shall be governed by the laws of the State of California and apply within the State of California. In the event that Proposition 65 is repealed or is otherwise rendered inapplicable by reason of law generally, or as to the Products, then Takari shall have no further obligations pursuant to this Settlement Agreement.

7. NOTICES

Unless specified herein, all correspondence and notices required to be provided pursuant to this Settlement Agreement shall be in writing and personally delivered or sent by:

8. COUNTERPARTS; FACSIMILE/E-SIGNATURES

This Settlement Agreement may be executed in counterparts and by facsimile or e- signatures, each of which shall be deemed an original, and all of which, when taken together, shall constitute one and the same document.

9. ENTIRE AGREEMENT

This Settlement Agreement contains the sole and entire agreement and understanding of the Parties with respect to the entire subject matter hereof, and all related prior discussions,

10. MODIFICATION

This Settlement Agreement may be modified only by a written agreement signed by the Parties.

11. AUTHORIZATION

The undersigned are authorized to execute this Settlement Agreement on behalf of their respective Parties and have read, understood and agree to all of the terms and conditions of this Settlement Agreement.
