

## **SETTLEMENT AGREEMENT**

### **1. INTRODUCTION**

#### **1.1 Consumer Protection Group, LLC and Force Factor Brands LLC**

This Settlement Agreement is entered into by and between Consumer Protection Group, LLC (“CPG”), on the one hand, and Force Factor Brands LLC (“Force Factor”), on the other hand, with CPG and Force Factor collectively referred to as “Parties”.

#### **1.2 General Allegations**

CPG alleges that Force Factor manufactured, distributed, and offered a type of consumer product for sale a Force Factor - Liquid Labs™ Energy Rapid Hydration Electrolyte Drink Mix Fruit Punch in the State of California containing Lead and Lead Compounds (“Lead”), which did not include warnings pursuant to the Safe Drinking Water and Toxic Enforcement Act of 1986, California Health & Safety Code sections 25249.6 *et seq.* (“Proposition 65”). Lead is known to the State of California to cause birth defects, other reproductive harm, and cancer.

#### **1.3 Product Description**

The type of product covered by this Settlement Agreement is defined as Liquid Labs™ Energy Rapid Hydration Electrolyte Drink Mix Fruit Punch (“Subject Product”) that Force Factor sold, offered for sale and/or distributed in California containing Lead.

#### **1.4 Notice of Violation**

On June 10, 2025, CPG served Force Factor, IHerb LLC (“IHerb”) and the requisite public enforcement agencies eligible to initiate Proposition 65 actions on behalf of the People of the State of California, with documents entitled “60-Day Notice of

Violation” that provided Force Factor, and such public enforcers with notice that Force Factor was allegedly in violation of California Health & Safety Code section 25249.6 for failing to warn consumers and customers that the Subject Product exposed users in California to Lead.

To the best of the Parties’ knowledge, no public enforcer has commenced or is diligently prosecuting the allegations set forth in the Notices.

#### 1.5 **No Admission**

By execution of this Settlement Agreement, Force Factor and its affiliates and subsidiaries, parents, directors, officers, agents, employees, attorneys, representatives, shareholders, successors, and assigns and each entity to whom Force Factor directly or indirectly distributes or sells the Subject Product, including but not limited to downstream distributors, wholesalers, customers, retailers, marketplace retailers, franchisees, cooperative members and licensees (collectively, the “Releasees”), do not admit any facts or conclusions of law, including, but not limited to, any facts or conclusions of law regarding any violation of Proposition 65, or any other statutory, regulatory, common law, or equitable doctrine. Nothing in this Settlement Agreement shall be construed as an admission by the Releasees of any fact, conclusion of law, issue of law, or violation of law. Nothing in this Settlement Agreement, nor compliance with its terms, shall constitute or be construed, considered, offered, or admitted as evidence of an admission or evidence of fault, wrongdoing, or liability by the Releasees in any administrative or judicial proceeding or litigation in any court, agency, or forum. Except for the allegations settled and compromised, nothing in this Settlement Agreement shall prejudice, waive, or impair any right, remedy, argument, or defense that CPG or Force Factor, may have against one

another in any other pending legal proceeding as to allegations unrelated to the dispute or claims released herein. Notwithstanding the allegations in the Notices, Releasees maintain that they have not knowingly manufactured or distributed, or caused to be manufactured or distributed, the Subject Product for sale in California in violation of Proposition 65.

1.6 **Effective Date**

For purposes of this Settlement Agreement, the term “Effective Date” shall mean the date this agreement has been fully executed.

2. **INJUNCTIVE RELIEF: WARNING**

2.1 **Commitment to Reformulate or Warn**

As of 30 days after the Effective Date, Force Factor shall not sell or offer the Subject Product for sale in the State of California unless they are Reformulated Product as outlined in Section 2.2 or Force Factor provides warnings as outlined in Section 2.3. Products that are in the stream of commerce prior to 30 days of the Effective Date shall be deemed exempt from the requirements of this Section 2 and shall be permitted to be sold through as previously manufactured, packaged, and labeled as they have been considered in the calculation of the civil penalties due.

2.2 **Reformulation Standards**


“Reformulated Product” are defined as those Product containing Lead in concentration no more than 0.5 micrograms of Lead based on a single serving per day.

2.3 **Warning**

The warning requirements set forth in Section 2 shall apply only to Subject Product that Force Factor distributes, markets, sells, or ships for sale in the State of California after the Effective Date that have not been reformulated as set forth in Section 2.2.

2.4 **Warning Language**


Any warnings provided pursuant to this Section 2 shall be provided in such a conspicuous and prominent manner that will ensure the message is made available and likely to be read, seen, or heard by the consumer prior to, or at the time of, the sale or purchase. Where required, Force Factor must provide any one of the following Proposition 65 warnings:

 **[CALIFORNIA PROP. 65] WARNING:** Consuming this product can expose you to chemicals including Lead and Lead Compounds, which are known to the State of California to cause cancer and birth defects or other reproductive harm. For more information go to [www.P65Warnings.ca.gov/food](http://www.P65Warnings.ca.gov/food)

**Or, prior to 1/1/2028**

 **WARNING:** Cancer and Reproductive Harm – [www.P65Warnings.ca.gov/food](http://www.P65Warnings.ca.gov/food)

**After 1/1/2028,**

 **WARNING:** Can expose you to Lead and Lead Compounds, a carcinogen and reproductive toxicant. See [www.P65Warnings.ca.gov/food](http://www.P65Warnings.ca.gov/food)

This shall constitute compliance with Proposition 65 with respect to the chemical in the Subject Product. The provisions of Section 2 shall not apply to any of the Subject Product that are already in the stream of commerce or existing inventory. Where a warning label is used for a Subject Product which exceeds 0.5 micrograms of Lead based on a single serving per day, includes consumer information as defined by California Code of Regulations title 27 §25600.1(c) in a language other than English, the warning must also be provided in that language in addition to English. Should Force Factor sell or distribute any Subject Products that exceeds 0.5 micrograms of Lead based on a single serving per day through the internet the warning will be posted in the manner provided for with respect to internet sales, as provided for in 27 CCR sections 25601 and 25602, or as either section maybe subsequently amended. If Proposition 65 warnings for lead should no longer be required, Force Factor shall have no further obligations pursuant to this Settlement Agreement. In the event that Proposition 65 warning requirements are amended in the future, Defendant agrees to comply with such amendments in accordance with the Proposition 65 statute and implementing regulations then in effect.

3. **PENALTIES PURSUANT TO HEALTH & SAFETY CODE SECTION**

**25249.7(b)**

In settlement of all the claims referred to in this Settlement Agreement, Force Factor shall pay a total of four thousand dollars (\$4,000.00) in civil penalties in accordance with this Section. The penalty payment will be allocated in accordance with California Health & Safety Code section 25249.12(c)(1) & (d), with 75% of the funds remitted to the California Office of Environmental Health Hazard Assessment (“OEHHA”) and the

remaining 25% of the penalty remitted to CPG. CPG's counsel shall be responsible for delivering OEHHA's portion and CPG's portion of any penalty payment made under this Settlement Agreement.

**4. REIMBURSEMENT OF FEES AND COSTS**

The Parties reached an accord on the compensation due to CPG and its counsel under the Private Attorney General doctrine and principles of contract law. Under these legal principles, Force Factor shall reimburse CPG's counsel for fees and costs, incurred as a result of investigating and bringing this matter to Force Factor attention. Force Factor shall pay Consumer Protection's counsel forty-one thousand dollars (\$41,000.00) for all attorneys' fees, expert and investigation fees, and related costs associated with this matter and the Notices.

**5. PAYMENT INFORMATION**

Within fourteen (14) days of the Effective Date, Force Factor shall make a total payment of forty-five thousand dollars (\$45,000.00) for the civil penalties and attorney's fees/costs to Plaintiff's counsel, Blackstone Law APC by wire transfer. Plaintiff's counsel will provide Force Factor with wire instructions and tax forms prior to payment. Other than this payment, each side is to bear its own attorneys' fees and costs.

**6. RELEASE OF ALL CLAIMS**

**6.1 Release of Force Factor, Downstream Customers and Upstream Vendors**

In further consideration of the promises and agreements herein contained, and for the payments to be made pursuant to Sections 3, 4 and 5 above, CPG, in its individual capacity, and on behalf of itself, its past and current agents, representatives, attorneys,

successors and/or assignees, hereby waives all rights to institute or participate in, directly or indirectly, any form of legal action and releases all claims relating to the Subject Product, including, without limitation, all actions, and causes of action, in law or in equity, suits, liabilities, demands, obligations, damages, costs, fines, penalties, losses or expenses (including, but not limited to, investigation fees, expert fees and attorneys' fees) of any nature whatsoever, whether known or unknown, fixed or contingent (collectively "Claims"), against (a) Force Factor, (b) each of Force Factor's downstream distributors, IHerb, wholesalers, vendors, licensors, licensees, auctioneers, retailers, franchisees, dealers, shareholders, cooperative members, customers, owners, purchasers, users, and (c) Force Factor's parent companies, corporate affiliates, subsidiaries, and their respective officers, directors, attorneys, representatives, shareholders, agents, and employees, and sister and parent entities.

CPG also, in its individual capacity, on behalf of itself, its past and current agents, attorneys, successors, and/or assignees and *not* in its representative capacity, provides a general release herein which shall be effective as a full and final accord and satisfaction, as a bar to all actions, causes of action, obligations, costs, expenses, attorneys' fees, damages, losses, claims, liabilities and demands of any nature, character or kind, known or unknown, suspected or unsuspected, against Force Factor and the Releasees with regards to the Subject Product. CPG acknowledges that it is familiar with California Civil Code section 1542, which provides as follows:

A GENERAL RELEASE DOES NOT EXTEND TO CLAIMS THAT THE CREDITOR OR RELEASING PARTY DOES NOT KNOW OR SUSPECT TO EXIST IN HIS OR HER FAVOR AT THE TIME OF EXECUTING THE RELEASE AND THAT, IF

KNOWN BY HIM OR HER, WOULD HAVE MATERIALLY AFFECTED HIS OR HER SETTLEMENT WITH THE DEBTOR OR RELEASING PARTY.

CPG in its individual capacity only, and on behalf of itself, its past and current agents, representatives, attorneys, successors, and/or assignees expressly waives and relinquishes any and all rights and benefits which it may have under, or which may be conferred on it by the provisions of California Civil Code section 1542 as well as under any other state or federal statute or common law principle of similar effect, to the fullest extent that it may lawfully waive such rights or benefits pertaining to the released matters. The release in this section shall have no force or effect until payments for the full amount set forth in above Sections 3, 4 and 5 are paid in full to Blackstone Law, APC by Force Factor.

6.2 **Force Factor Release of Consumer Protection Group, LLC.**

Force Factor waives any and all claims against CPG, its attorneys and other representatives, for any and all actions taken, or statements made (or those that could have been taken or made) by CPG and its attorneys and other representatives, whether in the course of investigating claims or otherwise seeking enforcement of Proposition 65 against it in this matter, and/or with respect to the Subject Product. Force Factor represents that its signatory to this Settlement Agreement has full authority to enter into and legally bind Force Factor to this Settlement Agreement.

7. **GOVERNING LAW**

The terms of this Settlement Agreement shall be governed by the laws of the State of California and apply within the State of California. In the event that Proposition 65 is

repealed or is otherwise rendered inapplicable by reason of law generally, or as to the Subject Product, then Force Factor shall have no further obligations pursuant to this Settlement Agreement, but shall have no recourse to claw back payments already made in accordance with Section 3, 4 and 5 of this Settlement Agreement.

**8. NOTICES**

Unless specified herein, all correspondence and notices required to be provided pursuant to this Settlement Agreement shall be in writing and personally delivered or sent by: (i) first-class, (registered or certified mail) return receipt requested; or (ii) overnight courier on any party by the other party at the following addresses:

**9. COUNTERPARTS; FACSIMILE/E-SIGNATURES**

This Settlement Agreement may be executed in counterparts and by facsimile or e-signatures, each of which shall be deemed an original, and all of which, when taken together, shall constitute one and the same document.

**10. COMPLIANCE WITH HEALTH & SAFETY CODE SECTION 25249.7(f)**

CPG agrees to comply with the reporting requirements referenced in California Health & Safety Code § 25249.7(f).

**11. ENTIRE AGREEMENT**

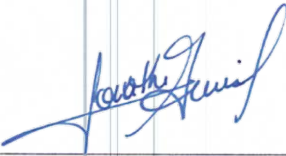
